The main point of the essay is *to prove what you think about the text* through analysis and engaging specific quotes from the text. Quotes should be chosen and placed throughout the essay carefully.

What do I say? How do I start? [Thesis/Topic Thinking] Initially, before polishing, your topic should involve your main thoughts on the novel.

[Topic Thinking] I think The Great Gatsby is a comment on the generation of the "Jazz Age" because Fitzgerald employs music as the background in many scenes.

[Polished Thesis] F. Scott Fitzgerald employs music as a background in many scenes of <u>The Great Gatsby</u> as commentary on the "Jazz Age" generation.

How do I prove my point? [Remind reader of where the quote happens, what the quote means, and why it may be significant]

When Jordan Baker tells Nick about the motivation behind Gatsby's mansion location, a Fats Waller song lyric breaks up their conversation, "'I'm the Sheik of Araby./Your love belongs to me./At night when you're asleep/Into your tent I'll creep—' " (Fitzgerald 78). This jazz song, a popular standard of Gatsby's time, reflects on Gatsby's nearness to Daisy; furthermore, the lyrics imply that Gatsby, like the Sheik, is lurking around Daisy and her love. [Here, bring this idea to your main point too – how does this connect to the thesis?].
